Dear Youth Directors and Chaperones,

RYM Colorado is an exciting conference for those who love the outdoors and the gospel! However, if you have not attended this conference before, you need to pay careful attention to the following information. Please read this letter carefully!

Activities

We will be offering mountain biking, horseback riding, ropes course, and rock climbing. Each of these activities is offered for a fee and demands a signed consent form from each student's parent. We will make these forms available online soon. We will be taking reservations before the conference and will be collecting payment and forms for the activities at registration.

Students and adults will also be able to sign up for the activities Monday night of the conference for any available spots. Please encourage each student to consider what he/she would like to participate in before they arrive. I would also recommend that they consider which activity they MOST want to participate in because there will not be enough spaces for everyone to sign up for every activity.

We will also have an Ultimate Frisbee tournament, a 3 on 3 basketball tournament and a huge Capture the Flag game. There is an indoor pool open each day and tennis, basketball and other sports options for free. Guided hikes will also be available as well on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, leaving at about 11:30.

We have planned many activities, but you are free and encouraged to plan your own activities off campus. We will have people on hand to advise and provide ideas. You may also accompany other groups. We will co-ordinate this at the chaperone's meeting Monday night.

More Information

Following is further information to help you in your planning.

- **Day Off.** Thursday from breakfast to Worship at 8:00 p.m. is free time for each group (That is correct, no elective classes will be held this day!). Several rafting companies that raft on the Poudre River are about an hour from Estes Park toward Fort Collins.

Other activities we would recommend are spending the day driving and/or hiking in Rocky Mountain National Park, shopping in the town of Estes, and visiting Six Flags in Denver or the Denver Zoo. Boulder is a great town to hang out in as well. Colorado Springs is about two hours away and is home to Pikes Peak, the Air Force Academy, Garden of the Gods, etc. Some helpful

- **What To Bring**

- Bedding and towels ARE provided
- Backpack – We will have a bag lunch every day, and you may want a backpack to carry lunch in to your activity. The YMCA campus is fairly big, and you will be doing a lot of walking.
- Water bottle – Everyone is encouraged to drink lots of water. It is dry out west and easy to dehydrate. Fluids also help to ward off altitude sickness. Estes Park is 7,500 feet above sea level, and you WILL feel it!
- Clothing – Jackets, sweatshirts and long sleeve shirts (it will be in the 40's at night, but hopefully warming to the 60's or 70's during the day), waterproof jacket/poncho for rain, sunglasses (the sun is bright up there!), bathing suit for indoor pool, and hiking boots/shoes.
- Sunscreen – The weather is cooler in the mountains, but the sun is more intense.
- Money for activities and snacks!

YMCA OF THE ROCKIES LIVERY
FULL AND GENERAL RELEASE OF LIABILITY - HORSEBACK AND PONY RIDES

Jackson Stables, Inc., a Colorado corporation operates a livery (horseback riding) business at the Estes Park Center, YMCA of the Rockies, near Estes Park, Colorado. Although Jackson Stables, Inc. has taken reasonable steps to provide you with appropriate equipment and skilled guides so you can enjoy an activity for which you may not be skilled, we wish to remind you this activity is not without risk. Certain risks cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of this activity. The same elements that contribute to the unique character of the activity can be causes of loss or damage to your equipment, or accidental injury, illness, or in extreme cases, permanent trauma or death. Jackson Stables, Inc. does not want to frighten you or reduce your enthusiasm for this activity, but we do believe it is important for you to know in advance what to expect and to be informed of the inherent risks. The following describes some, but not all of those risks.

Horseback riding is classified as a RUGGED ADVENTURE RECREATIONAL SPORT ACTIVITY and there are numerous obvious and non-obvious inherent risks always present in such activity despite all safety precautions. Horses are 2 to 10 times larger, 10-40 times more powerful, and 3 to 4 times faster than a human. If a rider falls from a horse to the ground, it will generally be at a distance from 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 feet, and the impact may result in injury to the rider. If a horse is frightened or provoked, it may divert from its training and act according to its natural survival instincts which may include, but are not limited to: stopping short; changing directions or speed at will; shifting its weight; bucking, rearing, kicking, biting, or running from danger.

Elements within Rocky Mountain National Park, and Estes Park Center, YMCA of the Rockies, can scare a horse, causing it to fall or react in some potentially hazardous way. Some examples are: hikers, bicyclists, vehicles, thunder, lightning, rain, wind, water, wild and domestic animals, insects, reptiles, and irregular footing on out-of-door groomed or wild land which is subject to constant change in condition according to weather, temperature, and natural and man-made landscape. Wearing a helmet while riding a horse is a basic precaution and certain risks of injury or death cannot be avoided if one is not used.

The undersigned desires to horseback ride.

The undersigned understands the potential dangers that he or she could incur in mounting or dismounting a horse and in riding a horse. Understanding those risks, the undersigned hereby fully and forever discharges and releases said Jackson Stables, Inc., its officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents and volunteers, from all liability, claims, demands and causes of action, if any, in the event of any injury and damage to the undersigned or to the property of the undersigned (including perhaps even death). This release shall be in effect whether such liability, claim, demand, or cause of action is based upon negligence, gross negligence, recklessness, willful and wanton conduct, breach of contract (express or implied) or upon any other legal theory of any nature whatsoever; and shall be effective regardless of the riding ability of the undersigned.

In addition, a Colorado statute mandates that the following warning be included herein:

WARNING: Under Colorado Law an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Section 13-21-119, Colorado Revised Statutes.

This release shall be binding upon the undersigned, together with his or her heirs, devisees, beneficiaries, personal representatives and agents.

If the undersigned is signing this Release for a person who is under the age of eighteen years, then he or she is doing so as a representative of said minor, and will have to designate the representative capacity by circling one of the choices on the signature line; and by so doing verifies and acknowledges that he or she has that authority. The Colorado statutes (Sections 13-22-107 and 19-1-103) define these representative capacities, for this purpose, as follows:

“Parent” means natural parent or a parent by adoption of the minor.

“Guardian” means the duty and authority vested by court action to make major decisions affecting the minor.

“Legal Custody” means the right to the care, custody and control of the minor including the duty to provide medical care and discipline for the minor.

“Legal Representative” means a person designated by a court to act on behalf of a person regarding contact with that person and regarding obtaining certain records concerning that person.

“Physical Custodian” means a guardian, whether or not appointed by a court, with whom the minor is residing.

“Responsible Person” means a person who is responsible for the child's health and welfare.

The undersigned, for himself, herself, or in the representative capacity for a person under the age of eighteen years, hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Jackson Stables, Inc., its officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents and volunteers, from all liability, claims, demands and causes of action in the event of injury (including death) including costs and reasonable attorney fees, to the undersigned and his or her property, or to the minor, and his or her property for whom the undersigned is signing this Release.
